- 3) School Improvement Plan: Mrs. Lundell shared and went over data from a staff survey on Trustland spending and school improvement goals. Staff had positive responses, especially for hiring/utilizing aides for targeted interventions and oversized classes, personalized learning tech licenses and upgrading tech hardware, and then subs for visiting/observing in other schools and classrooms for professional development opportunities. The conversation was had to be sure the tutors we hire are being trained to build their capacity to help students progress in the most effective ways, as they work under the direction of the teachers.

The school report card was shared and we have two sub populations that aren't making the expected growth: Special Education and the ESL learners.

4) School Business: Digital Citizenship and Safe Technology presentation was given by Tara Turner, school STS. District devices are filtered (iBoss and UEN) on or off premises, but if students use cellular data or hot spots, rather than wifi on their own devices brought into the school, those filters aren't working. A Netsafe assembly will be coming to Clinton to share ideas for internet safety, arranged by Mrs. Lundell. We do rely on parents to share ideas of internet safety and expectations at home with our students, in addition.

Mr. Dastrup, sixth grade teacher, has been researching the Summit Learning Platform. He is interested in rolling this out for the sixth grade students in the future. Mrs. Lundell shared information from a staff visit to see the program in action at Farmington Elementary with she and Mr. Dastrup, Mrs. James, and Mrs. Turner. It was recommended that Mr. Dastrup also visit Kays Creek Elementary and look at their self-created modules. (Maybe utilizing One Note) There is not a lot of available data for elementary level use with Summit at this point, but the council agreed that it is something that could be explored on the grade level, but suggest looking at a couple of other learning platforms, as well, such as Canvas or what Kays Creek is using.
