- 1. Welcome: In attendance: Jen Merrill, Becca Dastrup, Maree Pope, Taryn Philpott, Julie Lundell, Alicia Chatterton, Lori James
- 2. Review of Minutes: Jen Merrill reviewed minutes, and they were approved by Maree Pope and seconded by Jen Merrill .
- 3. School Improvement Plan- We discussed the School Land Trust TSSP plan and reviewed the 2020-2021 TSSP goals. We were unable to measure the math goal for that year with no RISE testing occurring during the 2020 school year. We were very close to meeting our reading goal at having 58% of the proposed 65% of students showing typical or better reading progress in Pathways to Progress, with 62% of students showing typical or better progress by end of the year, and we have succeeded in making our reduction in school discipline incidences/SEL goal. We also reviewed current progress on the 2021-2022 goals in place, and are progressing in each of the goals for reading, math, and reduction in school discipline incidences. Reading is to have 62% of K-4 show typical or better progress at EOY. Math is to have 70% or more students scoring proficiently on a preselected Rise benchmark test in math. We are working to reduce discipline incidences by 10%. We then discussed the funding with the TSSP and goal proposals for the 2022-2023 school year. We are intending to have 62% or more K-4 students show typical or greater progress in EOY Acadience reading assessments according to the Pathways to Progress. We want to have 50% or more students making typical or better growth in the K-3 Acadience math tests, and in the MAPS math testing for grades 5-6 in comparing BOY to EOY data. We intend to set up a STEM lab to support more math growth in association with that goal, as well. We are also considering work toward attendance improvements with a current total of 69 students having chronic attendance issues. We discussed the funding associated for each goal, with the bulk going towards the teaching assistants to help in support of the reading and math goals and growth, as well as technology to support the goals.
